

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### AUSTRALIA DAY AT WANDONG

Darlene Gunter and Robert Jensen, pictured with Federal Member for McEwen Rob Mitchell and Mitchell Shire Central Ward Councillor Louise Bannister, were honoured by the Wandong - Heathcote Junction community when they were presented with the Wandong Australia Day 2022 community awards. Congratulations Darlene and Robert.

On behalf of the Wandong Heathcote Junction community, Cr Bannister acknowledged Rob Jensens' contribution to the Wandong Heathcote Junction community for the last twenty years. Rob, with wife Olga, can probably claim to be the founders of the Wandong Heathcote Junction Community Group. In 2001 they walked the town asking residents to sign a petition opposing a poor development being imposed on Wandong Heathcote Junction. Their efforts resulted in a committee being formed to take the development to VCAT and that committee became the Wandong Heathcote Junction Community Group. Rob has been a committee member of the group since and has been at the forefront of the numerous community group



projects such as the Pickett Walk and Say G'Day trail developments and on working bees such as Clean Up Australia, Tidy Towns, National Tree Planting Day and many more. He was one of six local representatives who designed and oversaw the construction of the Bushfire Memorial Park.

Cr Bannister also acknowledged Darlene Gunter who for many years has been on the LB Davern Reserve Committee of Management and been involved with the Wandong Warriors Junior Football Club. Darlene has been a very hard working volunteer in her time at the warriors performing many roles including team manager, secretary and treasurer. She also helped with sponsorship for an incentive if a player trained a certain amount of nights during preseason they received a free club hoodie and training shorts. Darlene has just about filled every role imaginable even for teams her boys weren't involved in if it meant getting them on the park. Her love for the warriors was evident for all to see and is still present to this day as last year she kindly offered if the club couldn't find a secretary she would help out where she could. The administration at the Warriors has nothing but respect for Darlenes contribution over the years to the warriors, amidst volunteering on other committees, and it has endorsed Darlene as a very worthy recipient of the award.

Robert and Darlene are certainly very worthy recipients of the Australia Day Awards.

# Wandong Primary School

Just like that a fresh school year has begun and we are beyond thrilled to be commencing the 2022 school year with our students and staff back onsite, in classrooms, learning together, face-to-face and of course catching up and playing with friends during recess and lunch times. As exciting as it is to begin a new school year, we recognise the unique circumstances and new challenges that may arise. We know that being in school is what is best for our students and we also know that a safe environment for students, staff, families and community is paramount.

### 3 V's: Ventilation, Vaccination and Vital COVIDSafe Measures

Thus, in alignment with Department of Education and Training, and the Department of Health's advice we emphasis the 3 V's: ventilation, vaccination and vital COVIDSafe measures as part of our comprehensive return to school plan. These measures include but are not limited to the distribution of rapid antigen test kits to students and staff, the installation of 21 air purifiers in classrooms, provisions for possible staff shortages as a result of isolation requirements and mandatory three-dose vaccinations for staff working in schools. Face masks are still required to be warn by students in Grade 3 and above when indoors, unless a lawful exception applies. Similarly, face masks are required to be warn by those whom visit the school aged 8 and above.

### Curriculum Day (28th of January)

All teachers and Education Support Staff attended an English Curriculum Day, on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> of January, to further their professional knowledge about the effective teaching of Reading. Exploring the most recent science about how the brain learns to read, staff engaged in five hours of lectures and hands on exploration. Together they extended their understanding of effective practise for improving reading outcomes, including leading scientific models which explain reading development and effective practise, the story and science of how we build a 'reading brain' from birth and how to deliver dynamic vocabulary instruction for all students (one of the instructional pillars underpinning instruction at WPS). This full day of learning followed on from previous professional development days delivered throughout 2021 which focused on upskilling teachers to successfully develop earlier reading skills, including Phonological Awareness, Phonics and Fluency for all readers.

#### First Days

On Monday the 31<sup>st</sup> of January students in Grade 1 – 6 returned through the familiar school gates, closely followed by our smallest and newest students... our Foundation grades on Tuesday the 1<sup>st</sup> of February for their first day of school. In the first few days classrooms worked to build and develop classroom communities and positive learning cultures that echo Wandong's values of Kindness, Curiosity and Pride as well as our continued commitment around School Wide Positive Behaviours before launching the terms inquiry focus.

### **Term One – Inquiry Topics**

We have a streamlined approach to Inquiry, with all of our cohorts, across all grade levels exploring varying concepts around Civics, Citizenship and Community. The Foundation grades have begun to build their understanding of and how to show the school values. Similarly, the Grade One / Two students have begun to learn about their responsibilities, rights and the choices they make in their lives and communities. Students in Grades Three and Four are exploring how we are all different and considering how we can respect those who are different from ourselves. Whilst students in Grade Five / Six have begun to evaluate the concept of Governments and consider if different societies need them.

2023 Enrolments: Lastly, 2023 Enrolments are now being accepted, with the first of our Open Evenings for 2023 Families being held on March the 28<sup>th</sup>. If you are looking to enrol or considering your local schools, please come along to find out more about our wonderful school and what we have to offer.

We look forward to proving you with further updates and insight into what is happening around Wandong Primary School in next months edition. Until then, stay happy, healthy and safe.





# GARDEN SCENE WITH GAIL

Happy New Year to all & what a warm start to the year. Crazy with the North-Eastern states experiencing flooding in areas. We are struggling to keep our gardens hydrated in this heat and hot winds will only make it worse, plants lose moisture through their leaves in addition to the soil at their base drying out. Hydrangeas are very susceptible to drying out in these conditions and in addition to watering them (including the foliage) you can pop a shade sail over them and secure it at their base to keep the intense heat from them. Umbrellas work well if you can stop them blowing away. If you water foliage of a night-time it may encourage powdery mildew, effecting Roses as well. In this weather I bet you're glad you've mulched, fertilised, and incorporated wetting agent around our plants and over our lawn. Wetting agent is fantastic it holds the moisture into the soil and provides the soil with a buffer zone to help withstand the hot conditions. On a hot day, even if you've watered in the morning, try to water again late in the afternoon, once the sun has gone off the plants that you're watering. In windy conditions avoid sprinklers as you lose a lot of water being blown into the air. Leaves of some plants can become transparent when watered in the sun or if the heat of the day is still on them. This can reduce the plant's ability to absorb the sun, moisture and nutrients through their leaves, thus weakening the plant. Regular applications of Seasol will assist in reducing stress and shock in plants and lawns. If you need to prune wait until the hot weather is on the way out because plants can lose quite a lot of moisture through pruning, particularly if it's a large plant and / or the branches are wide in diameter. Sometimes during hot dry conditions, we see where we may have used different plants in certain areas. Tough, hardy plants such as varieties of Yucca, Agave, Sedum, good old Diosma with it's beautiful golden colour, Ceanothus - brilliant blue flowers in Spring, Geraniums and Pelargoniums that tend to slow the growth of grass underneath them, which is an added bonus, larger plants like Ornamental Pears, so hardy and what about Flax and the Nandina varieties, amazing tough plants. If you are constantly watering and your plants aren't thriving and just existing, consider replanting with more suitable species but hold on, not yet. Just after the first rain in Autumn is an excellent time to transplant and, in the meantime, do some research on plants that you might consider, think of height at maturity,



We are looking for suggestions as to how Wandong should celebrate the anniversary of the Hume and Hovell expedition and we would like ideas to come from the community for this great event.







## Summer Safety

Summer in Australia can mean hot temperatures and unexpected storms. Don't leave it until it is too late to prepare your home.

Apart from the slip slop & slap message, we have put together some tips to help keep your family home secure throughout the summer.

- · Install sun shades to your windows to deflect heat;
- Check and repair any weather-strips and caulking to windows and doors to prevent any leaks;
- Inspect the outside of your home for any cracks to overhanging tree limbs which could fall during a storm;
- Spray your home & yard to protect from insects, pests and other creatures. Watch out for snakes and deadly spiders!
- Check that all your external security lights are still in good working order; replace globes if broken;
- Ensure no dangerous sharp tools, electrical wires, etcetera, are left out for little fingers to hurt themselves on;
- · Check that 'open' windows are secured with locks or bolts and are screened against pests; and
- Check your insurance policies to ensure you are covered for potential risks such as storms or flooding.

Whether you are lighting up the barbeque or lighting a fire pit, these safety tips are a good reminder.

#### The barbeque:

- Check the expiry date of your gas cylinder before using it with the barbeque or external gas heater;
- Ensure connections on hoses are tight with no leakages;
- Never use a hose that is perished or cracked; and
- · Never check for a leak with a naked flame!



#### The fire pit:

- Position your fire pit away from overhanging branches and on flat ground;
- Keep your fire small;
- NEVER leave the fire unattended stay within 50 metres;
- Have water on hand to douse the fire once finished; and
- NEVER light or maintain a firepit on a Total Fire Ban day!

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





On 28/1 a further 7 mls and then on the 29/1 another downpour with a recorded 28 mls with some flooding but little damage. A total of 75 mls over three days. This of course was good for gardens and replenished house tanks.

Sunday Creek dam was recorded to be 94% of capacity on 31/1.

# Clonbinane Rural Fire Brigade



### **Brigade Activity**

We have been very fortunate in this dry hot spell not to have extreme fire weather or any significant incidents in our local area. However, we are still early into the fire season, and it is predicted that our fire season will extend into autumn.

We have had several grassfires near the freeway and call outs for unattended campfires. With a big increase in people using Mt. Disappointment State Forest for camping and recreation; with it comes an increase with people lighting campfires. Unfortunately, many do not carry enough water to fully extinguish the fire before they leave their camp.

Well done to the community for mindful fire safe behaviour so far this summer.

A lot of work goes into preparation for high-risk day responses. Rosters are prepared; firefighters often remain at home ready for a quick response to their pager call outs. The fire trucks are prepared and are always operational. On hot days, firefighters must ensure that they are well hydrated and that their firefighting kits are ready to go.

### The Current Fire Danger

Grassfires are a big concern has most grass is now cured and, in some places, quite high. Our biggest fire weather threat is in February until we get follow up rainfalls. This season's high fire danger is likely to extend into autumn as profiled in climate change fire risk. A lightning storm or human error can create numerous fires in a very short period. The good news is that your local brigade is well trained and equipped for most situations and we are fully backed up by the full resources of the CFA. Be vigilant and not complacent -continue with your fire plan.

### Your Fire Plan

Continue to discuss your fire plan with your family and neighbours. Evaluate the risk to your property on a daily basis, looking at your fire weather forecast and environment around your home. High hot winds have brought more leaves off the trees. Do you need to clean your gutters again? Have a quick check. Is there additional rubbish lying about that needs to go tip bound? How is your property access to allow fire trucks easy entry and turn around?

### Grass slashing, Angle Grinders and Chainsaws

Many grass fires are started by heat generating machinery or sparks from slashers, brush cutters or lawn mowers hitting rocks or metal. Do not use this equipment on Total Fire Ban days. On higher fire risk days start your work early in the day when the wind is less, and the humidity is higher. Always have an extinguisher or fire suppression equipment in position where you are working —before you start work. Ensure that you have your phone handy to call emergency services if needed.
