Then she was faced with another adversity - breast cancer. Grateful for her Christian upbringing, she hung onto her determination also. She has been clear for 20 years now. Praise God!

With no lack of children in their lives now. As well as their own family she brings joy to many children as she volunteers at the Hudson Park miniature train ride in Kilmore.

# U3A Kilmore and District Incorporated will hold their ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING on Friday March 11. 2022

in The John Taylor Room at The Kilmore Library

A Guest Speaker had been invited but, as of going to print, this has not been confirmed. Instead it is hoped to present a screening of plans for the JJ Clancy Project. These next twelve months could be an exciting time with the project at the JJ Clancy Reserve approaching commencement. Our Secretary, Mark Perrott, is representing U3A on the planning committee for this project and is making sure our needs as an organisation are met.

At the most recent JJ Clancy Committee of Management meeting, held in mid-February, the initial plans for the Integrated Community Facility were displayed.

The current Change Rooms are to be progressively demolished with the aim to have 'in ground' works completed before winter.

The new building will be single story but with an arched roof over the main community use rooms and large windows looking out across the oval.

The building will have two parts with a 'breezeway' between Changing rooms and Gym in one part, Social rooms, kitchen/canteen, office and storage spaces in the other part.

There is a longer narrow social room and a smaller square space.

The floor surface is possibly going to be carpet tiles.

The Architect has won an Award for designing a similar mutli-use facility at another regional location.

Mark hopes to have copies of the plans and simulated pictures of the building to be able to project on the screen at the John Taylor Room after the AGM . It was suggested that work will start soon and as this current facility is used by sporting bodies, with the football season approaching, it is hoped the building will proceed quickly to completion. This is an exciting development for U3A Kilmore and District as it means our groups will be able to enjoy new comfortable facilities too. Our use will be during school hours, with the sporting bodies mainly after school hours.

The meeting will commence at 10am. Members of the public are invited to attend the AGM to learn more about U3A but strict Covid rules apply. You must be able to prove that you are vaccinated and Masks will be worn indoors.

## GARDEN SCENE WITH GAIL

Here we are again, it's already March and the beginning of Autumn. This is a lovely season with cooler mornings and evenings making it great sleeping weather. Our deciduous plants will start to colour up in colours of bronze, orange, green, red, claret and mixes of all especially the Chinese Pistachio. A pretty small tree growing to about 5 metres high by about 2-3 metres wide and these estimates may vary depending on soil type, location and other influences which of course can affect all our plants. Larger growing deciduous plants such as Claret Ash, Golden Ash, Pin Oak, Oak, Elm, Ornamental Pear, Robinia pseudoacacia and Plane Tree, just to name a few are absolutely stunning as mature plants. It's amazing how deep the colours are, Mother Nature is wonderful with her splashes of deep claret, golden yellow, rust, orange, bronze, yellow and lime green and variations of mixes. Visit some gardens to appreciate the beauty of Autumn, Mt Macedon, Lancefield, Woodend and the main thoroughfare through Wandong, very tastefully planted. After viewing mature varieties and if you are in the market to add a deciduous plant to your garden, source your favourite/s from a reputable nursery because it may be a good idea to order now, ready for planting in a couple of months. After the Autumn rains begin, start your hole preparation ready for the Autumn planting. Hopefully the ground will soften enough and make it a bit easier for digging because it's been a few months since we've had decent rain and the ground can be hard in some areas of our gardens. Remember to allow quite a bit of room for your new plantings and the ideal size of hole per pot plant is twice the depth and width. Sometimes, with hard ground you can be tempted to skimp on hole size but try not to because a hole not big enough may retard the expansion of the new roots that are trying to push into fresh ground, and this may result in the root ball continuing to stay in that shape, thus the plant will not do well, not grow well and be stunted. Take your time when preparing to plant, it will absolutely pay you back. If you are planting on the side of a hill, try to ensure that the high side of the hole is below the ground level on the lower side, this will aid in water being absorbed into the hole when you pop the plant in. This will work if you have prepared your ground with well-rotted cow manure, some gypsum and / or any organic matter that can improve the soil structure, absorption and drainage, so, so important. When you're ready to



choose your new plants, look at the area they will be planted into, ensure they can reach their maximum height without overhead trees, power lines or other obstructions impeding their growth, will their mature size and root system interfere with underground pipes and / or drainage? Some plants are renowned for an extensive root system such as the Liquidambar and Evergreen Alder and care needs to be taken to plant them where this will not be an issue. Enjoy the first month of Autumn and we'll chat next month.


weeks students have been having these classes and have been having an absolutely awesome time.

We are looking for suggestions as to how Wandong should celebrate the anniversary of the Hume and Hovell expedition and we would like ideas to come from the community for this great event.





#### **SNAKES**

# Australia is known for its snakes and spiders and many Australians fear them.

Late summer is when many snakes are breeding and that can mean there is a mini influx of new born snakes around this time of the year across our shire.

Although shy, they become very defensive when discovered from their hiding place so keep clear and call a snake catcher to safely remove them and keep them all safe.



We have put together a list of extremely venomous snakes found in our area.

#### **Red-bellied Black Snake**

Colour is glassy dark black with the lower scales on the side onto the belly red or pinkish. It can be 2m long but 1.5m is more common.

#### **Eastern Brown Snake**

The colour is highly variable, ranging from pale yellow to almost black. It can be 2m long but 1.5m is more common.

#### **Copperhead Snake**

Colour varies markedly from very pale brown, coppery to almost black. The snake's sides vary from pale yellow to orange-red. The head is typically a darker colour. It can be 1.5m long but 1.2m is more common.

#### Tiger Snake

The bands associated with this snake can be more or less absent and the colour can range from light brown to black with the scales on the belly yellow. It can be 1.5m long but 1.1m is more common.

#### Snake Bite first aid:

- 1. Call an ambulance on 000
- 2. Remain as still as possible

- 3. Don't wash the site of the bite
- 4. Apply a bandage over the limb

This in turn had an impact on our water storage dam, reducing it from 94% of capacity on 31/1 to 76 % on 28/2. No doubt house tanks were depleted during that time.

#### Dogs in a Covid World - Making Difficult Things Normal ....

Covid has changed the way we are doing just about everything... and this includes the way we socialise and train our dogs... For most of 2020, it was hard to find ways for your pup to meet new dogs or interact with different people.... instead we were encouraged to move ONLINE......

The trouble is dog's don't understand the World Wide Web.

We also need to remember that dog's are physical creatures - They learn by smell and touch. They like to immerse themselves into new environments, to splash in puddles, explore thru the undergrowth and even roll in horse poo.... This is how your dog burns off energy, both mentally and physically and this then makes it easier for the human handler to learn to work with their pups when dogs have distractions.

Working from home has also meant that dogs might not have clear boundaries imposed... Dogs have had their humans at their

beck and call.... And the dogs have trained their humans well... Does this example sound familiar...:

- Dog wants to go outside and goes to the door... mum opens the door....
- Dog wants to come back inside and whinges at the door... mum opens the door....
- If the door doesn't open, the dog might bark... or scratch... mum opens the door...
- If mum tries to ignore, dog barks louder, throws his body at the door... mum opens the door.
- Mum on a zoom meeting... dog barks and jumps on her.... Mum gives a pat and a treat to try
  and pacify the dog....

Now released from Lockdown, families are having trouble coping with their Covid Pups... Lack of life experience is the issue. Hence, behaviours such as 'Separation Anxiety', 'Fear of New Things, 'Dog Reactive', 'Barking', 'Aggression to Strangers' etc....

Families now seek help but it can be difficult to find.... these dogs are too old for Puppy School... These dogs are too reactive for obedience training... These dogs are too distracted/scared to work for treats or tricks... These dogs are too destructive to get out in the Dog Park....

All of these problem behaviours are because the dog has missed out on some crucial learning skills thru their first year in life... So what we see is:

- 1. Dog doesn't have SELF CONFIDENCE
- Dog hasn't learnt to have SELF CONTROL

**DON'T DESPAIR !...** although your dog may have developed bad habits, if you are serious you can achieve change - However remember that both YOU AND THE DOG have developed the bad habits - so you must **BOTH** change.

Hence why you might find it easier to have help... just like when you are trying to get fit you find a Personal Trainer, the same for your Dog Work... and just like with getting fit... you might need to hunt around for the right Trainer.

Seek a Trainer who has the experience working with behavioural problems and who makes you feel positive.

# Clonbinane Rural Fire Brigade



#### Fire Danger Status

We have been fortunate that this fire season has not produced above average CFA turnout responses in our own area. Clonbinane CFA wish to acknowledge your vigilance and fire prevention work that you have carried out so far this season.

The fire danger season is not over taking into consideration the long dry grass that remains in many paddocks and roadsides. We can experience heat waves in March, however significant fires can emerge with strong cooler southerly winds if there is an ignition point in dry grass. We are still in the declared Fire Danger Period which means no burning off is allowed regardless of weather conditions. You may also experience planned fuel reduction burns later in the month and may smell or see smoke. There will be notifications of planned burns in the media.

The cooler mornings indicate that autumn is approaching; however, be aware that bushfires can still occur and spread quickly in the cooler months due to fuel load, wind and the low moisture content of that fuel. We have experienced some big fires at this time of year. These fires have not necessarily been on warm days and are often driven by a strong southerly wind. With significant moisture in the north of the country our outlook is unstable as warm fronts and cooler moist fronts clash. This can bring thunderstorms and possible fires ignited by lightning strikes.

#### **Brigade Activity**

The Clonbinane CFA has been busy with call outs to truck fires, car fires, LPG leaks, grassfires and a Strike Team overnight task at Mt. Camel. (See photo).

#### **Campfires**

If you are camping over the Labour Day Long Weekend or Easter and have a fire, you must have an area cleared in at least 3 metres in all directions and have water available to extinguish a fire. In National and State Parks, campfires and barbecues may only be lit in designated constructed fireplaces provided. A ring of rocks is not considered a fireplace under these terms. Do not deposit glass, aluminium, plastic, rubbish or scrap food products into your campfire. Please take these home with you. Leaving these items at your campsite is littering and subject to on-the-spot fines.

Do not light a fire or maintain a fire on warm or hot days when wind speed is in excess of 10 KPH. This is one of conditions that allows us to have campfires on public land such as forest camping areas. In NSW campfires are banned in the declared fire danger period. In Victoria campfires are allowed for cooking or warmth if the conditions are being followed.

A responsible adult must always attend and supervise a solid fuel campfire or barbeque. In attendance means being within 50 metres and having line of sight from the outer perimeter of your solid fuel campfire or barbecue. You must always fully extinguish your campfire with water, not dirt scraped over the top of it.

You cannot leave any hot embers remaining in your campfire. Remember, if your campfire is cool to touch, it is safe to leave. Ensure you have adequate water available to extinguish a fire before you light it. Our nearby forest camp areas do not have water available; you must bring it in with you.
