

GARDEN SCENE WITH GAIL

'Wow, Christmas Already!'

Well, technically, we're into Summer and I wonder what this season will bring. We've had a lot of rain and the plants, big and small, have revelled in it however, the weeds have also loved it, they are lush and so healthy. Blackberries have grown crazy, the little devils, so how do we control (eradicate) them? This can be a long process depending on how much cash you have to allocate to them, time available to devote to them and accessibility to the plants because some areas are so steep, overhead spraying is essential. Spraying can be quite effective however, if using herbicides isn't your choice of treatment and the area affected is flat enough for machinery to access, you can slash, rip out with machinery and discard the canes. If you miss any rhizomes underground, they will continue to grow, and you will need to redo the process. Young plants will emerge in Spring however, this process can be carried out at any time of the year. If you choose to use a herbicide, Spring is a great time, as the young plants are emerging and growing profusely and being so active the herbicide is systemically absorbed into the plant quite quickly and effectively. If you can treat black berries prior to flowers appearing, you will have a better success rate and if using herbicide there is minimal damage done to our bees and butterflies prior to flower formation. Once the berries appear birds eat them and drop the seed anywhere, further spreading the plants. Established weeds such as gorse and blackberries are havens for rabbits, wombats, feral cats and foxes and unfortunately if your soil has poor holding capacity and animals have dug holes with the cover of the weeds, this can be the start of erosion on your property. If you choose to spray blackberries, ensure you select a herbicide specific for woody plants so as not to do any damage to grasses surrounding the weeds. Due to the wet weather, we've been experiencing weeds in our gardens have been fairly easy to pull out however, as the soil dries, this will not be the case so if you can get weeds under control now, gardening will be easier. Keep in mind also as the weather warms up, our plants will experience drier conditions and some plants may have difficulty getting used to this because of our months of wet weather and you may need to ease some plants, (in particular, varieties of natives) into drier conditions by ensuring they are watered more often as they get used to the drier conditions. Deep watering's are preferable to encourage the root system to go deeper into the soil thus, decreasing evaporation of



moisture around the surface roots. Natives from Western Australia can find it difficult in our Victorian soils particularly in the areas where the soil is clay based, given that WA is predominantly a sandy soil, ideal for Protea, Waratah, Adenanthos, Leucadendron, Kangaroo Paw and some Grevillea. Of course, these plants grow here however, it is important to prepare your garden to help these plants settle in well by incorporating well-rotted cow manure and Gypsum, good organic additives that assist in grouping the clay into minuscule particles which allows water, air, and nutrients deep down into the soil to assist in keeping the roots healthy. Untreated clay can form a pan surface if you like, that can be impenetrable, and this stops all the goodies from getting to the roots of the plant and don't forget to mulch, this is essential for retaining

moisture around the root system. Have a lovely festive season. Gail Mains Kendrick (your local Real Estate Agent)

THE TIME HAS COME.

We can no longer put our collective heads in the sand and pretend that the A.R.T.C will not be building a new bridge at the northern end of Rail Street. After many meetings with the staff of ARTC we have at last been privy to some facts that we were not fully aware of.

- ARTC do not run the trains on our line, so we need to fight another fight with those who wish to bring 1. larger, noisier, and more invasive trains through Wandong. But that is a fight for another day.
- 2. ARTC have been given by the Federal Government the responsibility building a freight line from Central Queensland through to Melbourne. They will then lease time on the tracks to any one of several rail freight companies. Their only worry is to build and maintain the tracks.
- Our fight with ARTC is to try and protect our town from damage caused by the dismantling of the old bridge and the construction of a new bridge some two and a half meters higher.
- To achieve this, they will have to drastically alter the road heights on all sides of the new bridge, and in turn create large earthen banks on all sides to gain the necessary height for a new round about that will be some four meters higher than the current road surface just north of the northern end of Rail St.
- This is going to happen and will destroy the immediate surrounds. All we can do is let them know that we are NOT HAPPY and try to win as many concessions from them as we can in regard to our parkland being re-established after they have finished, also we must try and protect a huge number of mature trees that will be impacted by the road works.
- There are some people around who are saying that this will never happen. But some two weeks ago ARTC appointed engineers to start planning the works to be done in the Seymour area, and we along with Broadford will be next on their list sooner rather than later.
- We have two choices, we can either throw up our hands in despair, and bury our heads in the sand.
- Let them know that we are not happy and that we want our town protected as much as possible. Now is the time to get involved, don't wait till the damage is done.
- ARTC hold pop up days every Thursday from 10.00am till 1.00pm in the shop beside the chemists in Wandong Plaza, CALL IN AND LET THEM KNOW THAT YOU ARE NOT HAPPY, or just ask to see the maps and diagrams. Get involved, it is your town, don't let them ruin it..







We all know that the festive season can be an incredibly stressful time, however for Australia's 2.7 mil-

lion unpaid carers, the added pressure of caring for a loved one makes the festive season a little more challenging.

So what can you do to manage your wellbeing during this time?

Don't be too hard on yourself – both you and the person you care for deserve a break. If you are exhausted you will struggle to cope and perhaps have no enjoyment yourself.

2. **Keep it simple** – don't set unrealistic expectations and stretch yourself too thin. Routines are good, familiarity is reassuring, and by sticking to regular mealtimes you can reduce some of the pressure.

- 3. It is OK to change your plans – if your instincts tell you that plans are no longer appropriate, then it is ok to change your mind. If you think the person you care for will be unsettled, give yourself permission to cancel or shorten your plans to fit the situation.
- Ask for help we often struggle to ask for help and try to be all things to everybody. Remember that 4. you too are important, so delegate tasks, get some rest and say no to things as appropriate to ease some of the stress.
- Be Positive it's likely that something over the festive season will go wrong. In fact it is almost inevitable. Try not to panic, keep it in perspective, stay positive and try not to let it disrupt your plans.

- DON'T advertise your holiday on social media.


Before you leave on your holiday, submit an Absence from Residence form to your local Police Station. Police will add your address to their list of properties and do extra patrols past your property.







Bringing Home a New Pup ...!

This is an exciting time for families... A new pup is a new member of the household... So is this going to be a great journey or a regrettable decision..!

Getting Started

A new pup is a big responsibility so you really have to think about what is the best way to integrate a pup into the home. It is important to know that the better you understand how a dog works, the better the chance for a successful outcome.

Remember your dog will generally find our human world very confusing and as us humans are meant to have the 'bigger brain', it is really up to us to help the pup thru this transition period. So let's start with creating the basics for an easier home life.

TERRITORY - Your dog needs a safe and defined territory to live, this is the space that your dog sees as the Family Territory. It is very important that your dog feels connected to his family den, not penned off down the end of the backyard. (Pens are useful when the dog's family is away but otherwise your dog prefers to be close to the action). Your dog should have time inside with the family but also to be comfortable outside on their own. Regardless of where your dog spends most of their time, when outdoors, dogs require shelter,



perhaps a kennel or a raised bed preferably under the roof on the back deck where he can see the family thru doors.

Regardless of how big a block you live on, you should have a backyard and there should be a physical barrier that defines this Territory. Nothing beats a good sturdy fence, not only will this contain your dog, but it will ensure that your dog is safe from threats from outside, such as other dogs, people or wild life. This fence should restrict your dog within the backyard, hence will also allow access for public to your front door without being harassed by your dog.

Dogs often prefer having a buffer zone in place between your territory and any outside threat. Having the front yard as a Buffer Zone to the street will often prevent the dog feeling constantly on guard, he doesn't have to worry about who is going back and forward in the street, but only to bark to warn his family if someone approaches the front door. Sometimes your dog feels the boundaries are threatened. Perhaps the neighbour's dog charges the side fence and your dog becomes scared and retaliates. Often the solution is to construct a temporary fence to create about 2 metres of 'No Mans Land' this buffer should immediately defuse the situation.

HEALTH - A proper diet is essential to the welfare of your dog. BUT beware of the marketing hype which is designed to make you spend money on the latest trends. For many it is so confusing - constantly bombarded with advertising that is often intending to make owners feel guilty ... However, consider what we know about processed food with human kids - We have many kids overweight, poor teeth, allergies, plus other health issues. The same applies to your pets.... Even tho the packaging will try to lull you into thinking they are good for your dogs, these are generally full of preservatives and additives. (Note: sugar and salts are preservatives but are classed as 'natural' products). This allows kibble to be packaged, then trucked all over the country and stored for many months. Also remember that the nutrient details displayed on packs is the value of the raw ingredients **prior** to cooking but kibble generally uses three heating processes in production. So with any diet "just like with humans..... as close to natural is best".

A good relationship with the vet is invaluable. To monitor general health, such as dogs weight as well as making sure their teeth, ears, eyes and anal glands are all in working order. However, also question what is being offered by the clinic and ensure that this is best for your dog. Seek the help you need and don't be afraid to get a second opinion.

EXERCISE - Each dog is different and the physical and mental exercise that suits your dog can be difficult to place in time or kilometres per day. The trick is to ensure that there is variety, this will allow for mental stimulus, i.e. your walks should sometimes cover new territory, perhaps go to parks where he can meet new dogs. These new experiences will help to tire your dog much quicker than the usual walk.



The best way to know if you have success with finding the right exercise is when your dog gets home after an outing and is ready to chill out and relax. The more often your dog has the chance to chill the easier he/she will be to live with, however if your dog doesn't achieve this state of mind at least three times per week you will have problems.

Your Family's Fire Plan

Your ability to make good decisions will be impacted by many factors. The safest plan is to leave early. Use the FIRE DANGER RATING as a guide as to how a fire will react if one starts in your area. Clonbinane is in the North Central Region that is used for both weather and fire danger rating forecasts. Forecasted Catastrophic Fire Danger is fire weather that our homes are not designed or constructed to withstand in a fire. Please make yourself familiar with the new national fire rating system. (See attached image).

A late decision to leave is a dangerous option. Smoke blanketed roads, blocked roads due to trees down, emergency vehicles or even a wind change that will change the direction of the fire may prevent your escape.

Fire Danger Warnings

Visit Clonbinane CFA on Facebook for fire safety information. Clonbinane CFA does not post emergency—warnings, fire danger warnings or fire weather. Go to the CFA webpage, CFA Facebook page or Vic Emergency App. for up-to-date emergency warnings and forecast information. Emergency information is available directly on your phone by installing the Vic emergency app. Once you set up the app you will then need to set up your WATCH ZONE.

Fire Danger Forecast


