



GARDEN SCENE WITH GAIL

Well, it's our second month of Autumn and quite a few of our deciduous plants lost their leaves earlier this year, perhaps because of the lack of rain early in the season and late rain in the Summer months, it was very dry. Towards the end of the hot months, it seems to be an uphill battle keeping moisture up to our much-loved plants, let alone our lawn areas. It is nearly a relief to get the first good rains of Autumn. But now much needed work in our gardens can begin, pruning to reshape, regenerate or perhaps change the way some of our plants look, their appearance in our gardens. Take for example the sturdy Olive tree. They can create lovely shade and make beautiful strong trees as focal points in the garden. But what if we want to change their overall look, have you thought about a topiary look. Select the main branches, stems that you favour, prune them at varying lengths to create more interest and encourage growth at the end, gradually, over time, creating a ball effect at each tip. This interesting plant would be great towards the end of a path, as a vista, drawing the eye to it and possibly accompanied by smaller softer plantings, keeping the Olive as the main feature but enhanced by the lower plants and even a seat to enjoy the garden from a different perspective. A coloured/decorative wall behind the grey/green leaves of the Olive plant can also look stunning or perhaps team this with an old door painted in interesting colours for a bit of character. We are only limited by our own imagination. This is also a great time to revamp our gardens, with an application of fertiliser, well-rotted cow manure and in a clayey soil, some fine white sand and Gypsum. Incorporate well into the garden beds, around established plants and top dress the lawns as well. Take care not to dig deeply around established plants so we avoid damaging the root system. Sometimes if roots have been damaged the plant will sucker from the root, these suckers should be cut off and not allowed to grow with the actual plant. This can happen with roses and we end up with the stock plant, (which is what our selected rose has been grafted on to) growing strong and taking over from our selected rose, to its detriment. April is a good month to plant bulbs such as Hyacinths, Tulips and Daffodils and there are so many varieties you could go crazy with choice. When planting bulbs try to have the soil well drained and maybe, if it's a heavy soil, sprinkle fine white sand directly into the hole before you pop your bulb in, plant twice the depth as the size of the bulb and don't disturb the soil after the planting. Keep it weed feed without the use of tools, so the bulbs are not damaged. If you are considering adding some Autumn colour to your garden, it's a great time to check out the plants colouring up now. Check size at maturity and type of root system before you purchase to ensure you know what you're getting. This can avoid sadly cutting the tree down at a later date because it was unsuitable for that spot. You may be able to order your plant now from a reputable nursery centre, possibly as bare-rooted stock however, a lot of nurseries will pot up the plants before they sell them to you. This can avoid the roots drying out and your

plants stays healthy even if you don't get around to planting for a couple of weeks. If you are unsure about the planting procedure check with your nursery, a good nursery person will provide you with great tips on planting. Fuchsias and Roses are still flowering, and they look amazing, use a liquid fertiliser on them to keep them flowering for as long as possible and don't forget Pansies at this time of the year, they will flower for quite a few months and love liquid fertiliser to keep them happy.

As usual the WHJCG received no favours from Mitchell Shire in erecting the mural in preferred sites but we do thank Alpine Petroleum for allowing us to erect the mural in Wandong Plaza. We also thank all sponsors of the mural including the Bendigo Bank, ARTC, Wandong Wallan Lions Club and the Wandong History Group and of course a massive thanks to Vivian

Kenney who painted the mural free of charge. The WHJCG will shortly beautify the area around the mural with plants and mulch.

MAINTENANCE

In response to letters exchanged with Mitchell Shire regarding projects and the maintenance problems in Wandong Heathcote Junction, Mitchell Shire officers met three of our members on Friday 17th February.



One request made over many years and again at the meeting was to fix the problems at the Wandong Bushfire Memorial Park car park. Potholes at the car park entrance (see photo) are filled regularly when requested by the WHJCG, bollards and signs are regularly hit by vehicles and the drain between the car park and the Epping Kilmore Road is dangerous and a disgrace, you could lose your car in it (see photo). Mitchell Shire officers have told the WHJCG that nothing is planned in the near future but we should submit the project for consideration in the budget which we have done. We want

the drain put underground, bollards along the road removed, the car park sealed and parking to be angle parking off the road. The Shire refuses to recognise that this car park, toilets and park are the most visited on a daily basis in Mitchell Shire.

A month ago several loads of rubbish were dumped (see photo) beside the Wandong Broadford Road at Clonbinane - Mitchell Shire was advised and asked for comment but no response yet.

Two dog night

In the outback a weather indicator is often the statement it's a two dog night! The guest presenter at the April meeting of The Combined Probus Club of Whittlesea was a Black English Labrador dog called *Lola* a professional *Assistance Dog*.

She was accompanied by her constant companion Andrew Hall a retired Army Warrant Officer who served for twenty-seven years. Andrew is the Montmorency Eltham RSL Sub-Branch Senior Vice President and Welfare Officer. Andrew assists with welfare for service, ex-service veterans and war widows who seek support. He provides information, advice and any welfare assistance for the individual circumstance.

Andrew acted as Lola's interpreter as we learnt about Assistance Dogs.

Lola graduated from the Department of Veteran Affairs [DVA] Psychiatric Assistance Dog Program and came to live at Andrew's family home just on three years ago. There, every night is a one dog night! Lola can detect that a sleeping Andrew is under stress and wakes him either gently or more demandingly.

Most attendees were familiar with Guide Dogs trained to help the visually impaired or Hearing Dogs, but Service Dogs like *Lola* are especially trained for people with stress related illness. Andrew, like many veterans suffers from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder [PTSD

A medical definition of PTSD is "a mental health condition that's triggered by a terrifying event — either experiencing it or witnessing it. Symptoms may include flashbacks, nightmares and severe anxiety, as well as uncontrollable thoughts about the event". Andrew briefly advised details of his service in combat zones and how he was not aware of the illness that caused him to be medically retired after long stints in hospital. Eleven percent [11%] of current serving personnel have been found to be suffering with PTSD which is lower than the 15% of Vietnam veterans. Over the last 18 years over 1300 suicides have been reported and females are more likely.

Lola undertook years of training to help Andrew meet his clinical recovery goals. She and nineteen others were placed with returned veterans who had suffered mental distress. This was the start of the DVA Psychiatric Assistance Dog Program for veterans with a diagnosis of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Assistance dogs are provided to veterans to help support their treatment for PTSD. <u>Dogs for Life</u> is one of the dog training providers contracted to assist DVA to support veterans nationally.

Andrew associated with several of the dogs but they did not click. Finally he met Lola and an immediate life-long bond commenced. At that time Andrew was at a low point and was almost a total introvert, spending much time indoors inactive. Lola made him get active and during the six months that both of them undertook training the Dog for Life was confirmed. Seventeen of the veterans completed the trail and also have their dog for life.

Lola has never barked or bitten and is a bit unique as she can revert to a normal dog. She was loose in the auditorium and engaged with the public, but she was ever vigilant that Andrew was under duress. She reacted


when his voice tone changed. He did not feel it, but Lola sensed something and came to his side and altered him with a nudge! He explained that Lola is given a seat on Qantas planes and the crew often lets her wander around the aisles. They leave it to induvial passengers to decide if her skill is drug detection!

Like other assistance dogs a fostering of puppies for 18 months is necessary. During this time they and the foster family undergo training to prepare them for the intensive course as adults. During Covid Andrew transported five graduates to Western Australia by road and explained his first experience of separating the foster families. There is a CRITICAL need for foster families. Andrew said fostering gives not only the veteran but the family life benefits! There is no use by date for the Assistance Dogs but eight to ten years is the anticipated active life. The retired dog remains with the family. Andrew does not know if he will be in need of a further companion after Lola retires but is confident that her assistance has completely changed his life. He explained that Lola has also improved the quality of his wife's life, who was previously his only carer.

A number of questions were fielded by Andrew; to one Andrew advised that similar programs for non-service personnel are provided by National Disability Insurance Scheme [NDIS].

Finally, the speaker co-ordinator Teresa Carlin presented Lola and her assistant with a gift each to a round of applause from the audience.

Good Friday Appeal

Wandong Fire Brigade members will be collecting for The Royal Children's Hospital Good Friday Appeal again this year. It is something we look forward to every year. We will be set up on Epping-Kilmore Rd near the Magpie & Stump, and also at Wandong Plaza.

Only working smoke alarms save lives.

As we change our clocks back at the end of daylight savings, it is a great time to check the smoke alarms through the house. If you missed it on the 2nd April, do it right now! It could save your life.

Some handy tips to remember

- * smoke alarms should be installed in every living area and bedroom
- * smoke alarms should be tested monthly by pressing the test button until the alarm sounds
- * smoke alarms should be cleaned with a vacuum cleaner at least once a year
- * smoke alarms should be interconnected, so that when any alarm activates, all smoke alarms will sound
- * smoke alarms should be replaced after 10 years this includes smoke alarms attached to mains power
- * smoke alarms should be installed on the ceiling at least 30cm from the wall, or where installed on the wall at least 30cm from the ceiling

Fire Restrictions

The fire danger period in the Mitchell Shire end on Monday 10th April 2023. Even though we are beginning to experience milder conditions, there is still the potential for fires to occur. If you burn off after the conclusion of the fire danger period, please be mindful that the vegetation is still dry and its easy to lose control of your small burn-off. Take care and make sure you have water available at all times and never leave your burn-off unattended. It is important to always register your burn with the Burn-Off Notification Line on 1800 668 511. For more information see http://www.cfa.vic.gov.au/warnings-restrictions/can/.

Junior Fire Brigade

Wandong Junior Fire Brigade meet up between 6.30 and 8pm on Mondays at the station. Junior members are between 11 and 16 years old and live in the local area. Installing and Maintaining your Fire Suppression Equipment is required under the Building Code of Australia. Trained Wandong Fire Brigade members volunteer their time to provide this service to the Community and in turn raise funds for the Brigade to purchase equipment that protects the Community. All servicing carried out is compliant with the required Australian Standards. Our Forward Command Vehicle and FEM trailer have been provided through the work of these volunteers, and local individuals and businesses utilising this important service. MITCHELL AGILITY DOG CLUB (MAD)

MAD is a public dog training club operating in the Mitchell shire.

MAD offers weekly dog training classes year-round for a single membership fee (about \$60 per year) plus a \$2 fee per class. When time and trainers permit we also offer other dogs sports opportunities to our members including Rally, Tracking, and tricks as well as social opportunities like group walks.



All new members to our club start in our FOUNDATION Class.

This class is offered weekly and there is no minimum or maximum amount of time members spend in this class

This class has a fluid syllabus so exercises are regularly switched up or swapped out to keep it fresh and continue developing new skills.



In this level we focus on teaching good training practices; this includes

- 1. deciding what behaviours we want to teach and breaking the behaviour into small achievable steps towards the goal.
- 2. We go over how we can shape, lure or capture these behaviours depending on the dog and skill.
- 3. How we can mark them (let the dog know when they are doing what we want)
- 4. and reward the dog effectively in a way that reinforces the correct behaviour.

In this level we also build the dog's engagement and focus in or a full hour straight away in a group setting) as well as their

training (not all dogs can concentrate for a full hour straight away in a group setting) as well as their motivation, body awareness and confidence.

Some of the specific behaviours we cover in the foundation level include:

- Offering eye contact and connecting with the owner.
- Basic obedience behaviours Sit, stand, drop, stay, recall.
- Lifestyle skills such as resting on a mat calmly (great for cafes!), walking on a loose leash, passing or ignoring other dogs.
- Nose or paw targeting
- Stretching and strengthening exercises
- Proprioception (body awareness) and confidence in novel items (eg wobble boards, going through tunnels or stepping between the rungs of a ladder, going over a seesaw or dog walk, stepping up or in boxes)
- Tricks! Including; Spin, go around a cone, perch on a pedestal, jump through a hoop, straddle and weaving through legs.





Once members are ready to move up they then begin developing more specific skills in the area's that interest them.


Typically this is advancing in Obedience (including Rally) or Agility. **Obedience** helps members to train their dogs as well-adjusted, controllable companions.

It helps build reliability even with distance and distractions and mentally gives your dog a work out while building your bond together. Obedience works on set exercises that are done in close proximity to the handler and builds in precision and complexity.

Agility training compliments obedience training in building a working relationship between dog and handler.

It is a fast and active sport and requires a happy and motivated pairing of dog and handler.

Some member's may pursue trials and titling in these sports, others will use it to enrich the lives of their canine companion and improve their home life, some may use it to maintain their dog and



Our training methods are strongly based in positive reinforcement techniques.

We utilise reinforcers such as food, toys/play and praise as motivators or as a reward for your dog performing the appropriate or sought after behaviours.

Handlers are taught how to train their own dogs and for best results are expected to practice what is taught at home each week.



AT the moment the Club does set intake days regularly throughout the year.

Our next new member intake day is SUNDAY 30th APRIL 2023

Other dates for 2023 will be... 16th July, 1st October and Wallan Pet expo (TBC but approximately 18th November).

If you are interested head down to the back oval(behind the stadium) of LB Davern reserve in Wandong between 9-10am on that day.

We will be doing intro sessions one-on-one and manning admin the whole time so arrival is flexible in that time frame.

If after this session you would like to become a club member we will have membership forms available at the desk and can accept card, bank transfer or cash payments for membership fees.

Bring:

- Yourself.
- Your dog (**on collar and lead**),
- A copy of your dog's vaccination record (a photo is sufficient)
- Plenty of dog treats
 - → we suggest about 2 cups worth for a medium/large dog and a mix of low value (eg. kibble, diced vegetable) and high value (eg. diced prime 100 roll, cooked chicken)
 - → If your dog likes toys you can bring this down as well

What is In Person Peer Support?





Burning Off

Conditions have to be right! Windy conditions greatly increase the likelihood that your burn off may get out of control.

From past experiences we know burn-offs can flare up a couple of days after the burn-off, which highlights the importance of making sure your burn-off is fully extinguished and keeping an eye on weather conditions not just for the day of your burn but for the following days. We'd urge anyone who has burnt off in the past few days to double check that it has been fully extinguished.

The CFA Chief Officer urges Victorians to take extreme care when burning off. "We encourage residents to take advantage of the current window of opportunity to clean up their properties before the next bushfire season, but the effects of an out-of-control fire can be devastating," he said.

"It is absolutely essential that you have enough water on hand to put out a fire. There isn't enough time to run back to your house if your fire gets out of control. You should construct a fire break, free of flammable, materials around any burn-off." Property owners have legal obligations when burning off. Failing to comply with local council by-laws and state legislation can lead to a fine.

All calls to Triple Zero about smoke sightings are cross-checked with that register, and firefighters are called out if nothing is listed for that location. False alarm calls to unregistered burn-offs take volunteer firefighters away from workplaces, families and other emergencies.

Keep your burn off safe and legal:

- Always register your burn on 1800 668 511
- Check and monitor weather conditions particularly wind
- Warn your neighbours beforehand that there will be smoke in the air
- Leave a three-metre fire break, free from flammable materials around the burn
- Have sufficient equipment and water to stop the fire spreading
- Never leave a burn-off unattended stay for its entire duration
- If your burn-off gets out of control, call '000' immediately





Weather Report -March 2023

Heathcote Junction/Wandong

The first month of autumn when we start the transition from summer to winter. What a happy thought. Conditions during the month were comfortable without any major weather events. Temperatures also made for comfortable conditions which cooled during the last two weeks.

Rainfall was light with only 18 mls in the first half of the month and 39 mls recorded in the second half.

Our supply dam at Sunday Creek recorded at 71% of capacity on 27th March – a significate drop from 97% in February, understandable with dry conditions for the first quarter.

For comparison, the total for the quarter in 2022 was 145 mls – this year 57.5mls.

The Well Mannered Dog - Building Boundaries By Anne Zelvys IACP-CDT

Understand the difference between DISCIPLINE and PUNISHMENT ... ?

As a society we see hitting or smacking as aggression. Humans can often resort to this option when they become frustrated by situations they cannot control. Our objective is to build a bond with our dogs thus we need to avoid creating confusion for the dogs but human emotional responses just don't make sense to a dog.

If your dog behaves in a manner that is problematic, but you do nothing hoping the problem will just go away. Then your dog is unable to see the boundary hence this bad behaviour will continue....

Consider : Discipline & Punishment may appear similar, but actually have very different meanings!



DISCIPLINE - Is when you have set clear boundaries for behaviour. If the dog crosses the boundary then the Authority Figure (YOU) should step in and block the behaviour UNTIL the dog stops and withdraws from the action... Behaviour stops, then you stop... then ignore dog and go back to what you where doing.... (do not praise the dog for stopping, as this prevents the dog for seeing where he made the mistake).

If the dog then breaks the boundary again - the Authority Figure once again steps in to block the behaviour. Again you stop when the dogs stops and withdraws from the action. The dog starts to see a pattern, hence will diminish this behaviour.

Example: Dog barks – you growl using enough energy that makes the dog to stop barking – the second the dog is quiet you then drop your energy and even turn away... now wait to see what his next choice is.... Hopefully he will remain quiet or even walk away.

PUNISHMENT - Is when you apply physical or mental restraints when your dog breaks your rules. Sounds similar! However the difference is; that should verbal/physical restraints CONTINUE when the dog attempts to withdraw from the action, then you have now fallen into the category of Punishment.

Example: Dog Barks – you growl or perhaps even hit the dog - he moves away and becomes quiet however you keep yelling and threatening. The dog cannot see what is wrong, hence dog becomes confused.

Don't be afraid to try - Many families can be scared of enforcing discipline. Nobody wants to think that they would hurt their dog either physically or mentally. But if we are honest with ourselves, most people are afraid that the animal will become upset and no longer love them, so often the humans just do nothing... which causes confusion for everyone...

Well here is some good news - Your dog will be love you whether you discipline him or not. The love your dog shows is a dog love, which is different to a human love. After all, human love is varied and fickle whereas animals show love in an uncomplicated and honest fashion. What a dog finds really cool is when humans understand them.

If we learn how to create **clear boundaries**... we build respect, and this is really the best basis for love...... Remember, respect works best when it goes both ways.

Pet Fraud

A dog or cat can help with loneliness, give you companionship and someone to talk to, and sit with you during the evenings. This can be another way a criminal can defraud you!

Some of our aims are to minimise the incidence of preventable crime and deter criminal activity, but we also try to reduce the fear of crime. A dog or cat could be of benefit in order to give the person a companion and a built



in security system. Dogs are known to be a good deterrent to thieves but cats can also warn you of an intruder outside. Some researchers have postulated that socially excluded or lonely people may be more likely to view certain place or events as threatening (De Donder et al., 2005).

Pet scams have exploded in the wake of COVID-19. In Australia they have increased by more than 1000% over the last two years. Many people have seen the value of owning a pet when they were based from home, but along with the demand for pets came the number of scammers who were, and are still, greedily awaiting for the naive buyer to contact them.

Sometimes it comes with a plea for more money but in other cases, you are led on for weeks on end thinking that you have just purchased that very cute and loving puppy only to find that there is no cute puppy at the end and the breeder doesn't even live there anymore.

Some people are happy to get a new family pet from a shelter but others are prepared to pay significantly more and buy from breeders. If you choose to buy from a breeder, we suggest:

- Check whether the images are posted anywhere else on the web;
- · Check the testimonials of the breeder;
- Be extra cautious if the use a WhatsApp phone number. They start with 0480-0 or 0488-8;
- · Verify that the breeder is part of a Applicable Organisation which deals with the breeding of animals; and
- Ensure the breeder has a source number issued by Animal Welfare Victoria.

It is an offence to sell a dog, puppy, cat or kitten without the source number and animal's microchip number included in the advertisement.

Any source number quoted should be verified with Animal Welfare Victoria.

The ACCC says anyone who believes they may have given personal information or money to a scammer should contact their bank or financial institution as soon as possible. It also recommends reporting the incident via its Scamwatch website and to local police.
