AT LAST HEATHCOTE JUNCTION HAS A PLAYGROUND FOR KIDS









For years the Wandong Heathcote Junction Community Group has campaigned for facilities for the youth at the Heathcote Junction part of town.

At last, as compensation for losing three exercise equipment pods on the Say G'Day trail, Mitchell Shire has erected a childrens playground at the Heathcote Junction (North Mountain Road) end of the trail.

There are now two exercise pods and the playground on the Say G;Day trail between Kooralinga Drive and North Mountain Road.

It was originally intended that there be five exercise pods between Affleck Street and North Mountain Road to create a continuous and frequent row of exercise pods and to improve the connection between Wandong and Heathcote Junction.

Of the three built, one went into Davern Reserve and only two on the trail. Maybe future Mitchell Shire Councils will commit to fill in the gaps.

Seating along the trail was provided by the Wandong Heathcote Junction Community Group.

GARDEN SCENE WITH GAIL

Spring already and doesn't it go so quick and as the seasons change so does our work in the garden. This is a great time of the year to catch up on the plantings that you may have missed out on doing during Winter, early Spring is pretty forgiving to new plantings. Lots of Spring flowering plants have burst into blossom, ornamental pears, cherries, and many others, including fruit trees, and aren't plum trees so hardy and the lovely Prunus nigra is amazing with deep burgundy leaves, it's planted a lot on nature strips. This is a great time to choose plants for their blossom and there are some great varieties you may consider in addition to fruit trees, such as Crepe Myrtle and Forest Pansy and if you're interested in a very different leaf colour, try the Chinese Toon Tree, (Chinese Cedar) the leaves are pink all year through or Autumn Blaze Maple, stunning red leaves. If you are having trouble with kangaroos eating your plants, you may want to pop some wire around them and if you do that now it may be easier to get the stakes in while the ground is still a bit soft. I caught a kangaroo munching on one of my palm trees the other morning, having a wonderful time. If you are preparing new garden beds dig over with loads of well-rotted cow manure, it's great for improving soil structure, drainage, as well as providing nutrients to the plants. Choose plants that will do well in that particular area, taking into consideration the aspect, where the hot afternoon sun will be, how much shade is needed, and if it's a windy area. If you're lucky enough to have created a microclimate already with mature plantings to accommodate plants that wouldn't normally do as well, that's fantastic and it's worth remembering that if you have plants massed together, they may require deeper waterings and adequate fertilising, so they all get their fair share. Our bulbs look stunning when massed planted in swathes and they will do even better if we can liquid fertilise them while they are providing beautiful displays and as their flowering period comes to an end and just before the leaves begin to wilt apply a pelletised fertiliser that will eventually be absorbed into the bulb ready for their next flowering season. As our Daphne finish flowering and just before the plants push new growth take some cuttings, apply a hormone growth powder or gel or even honey on an angled cut and pop into good quality potting mix, keep moist but not wet or use the peg lay-



ering method by cutting half way through a low branch at a node using the hormone gel /powder/ honey and securing the cut branch into the soil or a pot on the ground. Keep weeds at bay while it's easy to remove them and if you can, apply gypsum, or any organic matter to the soil / garden beds / lawn, to encourage good soil structure and in turn, good healthy growth. The deeper the roots can go into the soil the better they can locate moisture, cooler conditions and better growth during the Summer period. Shallow rooting plants such as Rhododendron, Azalea and Camellia need to be checked regularly during the warm months particularly if you have a rabbit problem where they will dig near roots and expose fibrous roots causing them to dry out. After you have treated the soil follow up with a generous layer of mulch to suppress weeds, maintain as much moisture in the soil for the warmer months ahead and improve the soil structure.

We particularly need new members from the Heathcote Junction area. Our approximate borders are North Mountain road down to Janna road. To the west the border is Merri creek and to the east is Mount Disappointment State forest. Members don't need to live within the borders but our activities are largely in that area.

ARTC Inland Rail – IT'S NOT JUST ABOUT THE NEW BRIDGE DESIGN

The ARTC has finally provided a Reference Design of the new rail bridge at Wandong for community feedback, comment and questions. However, the new bridge is not all there is to the Inland Rail project's impact on Wandong-Heathcote Junction. There are still a number of impact issues that have been raised with the ARTC by the Wandong-Heathcote Junction Community Group which are yet to be addressed and answered. For instance, do you know –

- How your trips to and from Wallan, Whittlesea, Epping and beyond will be affected by the delays caused by 1.8 km long freight trains rolling through Heathcote Junction, Lightwood and Wallan level crossings?
- How the traffic bank-up at these level crossings will impact on road safety and driving behaviour?
- How, where, how often and by whom will the noise intensity levels during bridge replacement and then through freight train operations be measured and identified risks addressed? The trains will be travelling at a noise intensity level of 80 to 90db. Regular exposure to noise intensity levels of 70db and over is damaging to human hearing.
- How, where, how often and by whom will the air quality be measured for dust and other pollutants during bridge demolition, construction and freight train operations? By whom and how will identified harmful air pollution risks be addressed?
- If the transport of hazardous materials will be permitted on the freight trains travelling through our town past our school, shops and homes? Who will be responsible for risk management?
- Who will be responsible for removing the graffiti from all the concrete comprising the bridge and its pylons? Who will be responsible for removing the litter and maintaining the bridge roadwork embankments and surrounds?

If you want to know the answers to these questions, then go and ask the ARTC. It's your town, your well-being, and the quality of your environment which will be impacted.

THE FOOTPATH IS ON THE WRONG SIDE OF THE ROAD



The Wandong Heathcote Junction **Community** Group has alco requested to incorporate ARTC graffiti resistant walls and embankments and to move the footpath on the eastern side of the Wandong Broadford Road / Rail Street to the western side of the road by going under the bridge thus eliminating two pedestrian crossings and a footpath that will get little or no use if on the eastern side.

We have planted correas and grasses around the mural at Wandong Plaza and the key plate under the mural is now attached. A few weeks ago the mural was graffitied. CCTV, curtesy of Sam at Wandong IGA, has now been introduced so any graffiti attempts on the mural and pedestrian bridge will now be viewed and perpetrators hopefully prosecuted.

Following a meeting with Mitchell Shire officers, a survey of residents will be conducted to determine the preferred sculpture to replace the rotting wooden sculpture in the Lions Park. We now feel a sculpture depicting Wandong of the past eg timber industry might be most appropriate but residents may have better suggestions.

The ARTC has finally released its preliminary plan for the proposed new bridge. We believe the footpath on the east side of the Broadford Road should be on the west side by going under the bridge. A footpath on the east side would get very little use and requires two pedestrian crossings. We also want guarantees that surfaces used will be graffiti resistant. ARTC still have not provided documentation on how dust, noise, etc will be controlled.

The WHJCG has for many years implored Mitchell Shire to place the drain between the Bushfire Memorial car park and the Epping Kilmore Road underground, remove the bollards and seal the car park to make it the showpiece it should be as a major entrance to Mitchell Shire. The toilets at this location are the most used in Mitchell Shire but the Council chooses to prioritise lesser projects. We are told numbers of requests hold much weight when deciding projects so we ask the WHJ community to get on board and sign our petition or better still lodge a request to Mitchell Shire.

We have asked Mitchell Shire to remove the graffiti on the Council owned pedestrian bridge but this seems to be another time we will have to keep asking or do it ourselves.







Another 20 bags of rubbish were removed from the freeway ramps and the Epping Kilmore Road. CCTV on two of the ramps will help identify perpetrators. but If you see anyone rubbishing our towns please let us know or report it to EPA Victoria..

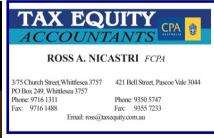

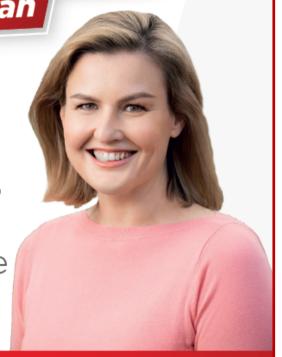

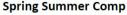

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Carer Gateway - Counselling

The Carer Gateway Counselling Service is a free service for carers.

As a carer you often have a lot going on in your life. There are appointments to make and then remember, medications to be given, the physical strain of providing care and sometimes there can be a financial burden as well. All this with little time to rest and recharge your batteries.

Caring can be tiring, overwhelming, isolating & stressful and at some point you may need to ask for some help.

Counselling helps you to find ways to manage what seems challenging and helps to find ways to cope with stress.

So what is counselling?

Counselling allows carers to tell their story and voice their thoughts and feelings in a safe and supportive environment.

Counselling is a conversation between yourself and a trained counsellor to help you resolve specific problems. After a brief introduction and getting to know you period, you and your counsellor will discuss the issues you may need help with. Your counsellor will encourage you to set some goals and together you will work to find the best way forward.

Counselling aims to help you gain insight to your thought processes and behaviours and give you tools and resources to resolve problems on your own.

Everything you discuss is private and confidential. The only exception is if something threatens your wellbeing or the wellbeing of others. Your counsellor will discuss this duty of care with you at your first session.

The Carer Gateway can provide up to six counselling sessions to carers and can be accessed either inperson or via phone.

Are You The Bad Human?

Helicopter Parenting: Consider a common situation when at the supermarket and some little kid is whinging and tugging on their mum and the mum keeps apologising to the kid, "It's okay dear we won't be long", or "Settle down darling, everything's okay", even worse, they hand the kid a chocolate bar to keep the kid quiet BUT, once lolly is finished the kid starts



again. Doesn't it make you want to Scream"BAD PARENT" (but you don't 'cause it's none of your business).

As a Trainer, that is how I feel every time I go to a Vet Clinic or a Dog Park... I see dogs who are Over-Excited / Anxious / Shrinking back / Lunging or even Jumping on Furniture.... and their owners are there holding the dog on a short lead and patting the dog, trying to calm the dog... "It's okay Rover we won't be long" or "Settle down, mummy's here" or "Oh..No.. don't do that" and all using a quiet and hesitant voice.. It makes me want to yell "BAD HUMAN"... (but I don't...)

First - Stop patting the dog to make him calm! When you take your dog out in public the dog needs to see that his 'parent' is confident... We must not confuse the dog with mixed messages. It DOES NOT make a dog feel better because you are patting them. Trying to reassure a dog when he is nervous is madness... they are a dog they don't understand your human words... Instead they interpret that YOU are worried and scared and this makes the situation worse. The dog feels you can be relied on, the dog don't TRUST you because you seem scared and might run away any minute.... "BAD HUMAN".

Second - Stop trying to bribe the dog with food! This does not work... Just like with a child, the human hopes that DISTRACTING the dog with food will solve the problem! However, because the dog is already so overwhelmed by the situation the dog can mentally shut down, they cannot think....but the human keeps trying to push food in the dog's mouth because they read somewhere we must use rewards to 'teach/distract' our dog... However this is not a teaching situation, this is a dog just trying to cope with now.

"Positive Only" Philosophy - Does not work under Stress in many of these stressful situations the dog's brain is fried... the dog cannot think... and instead only has an instinctive reaction which is to Fight or Flight... Consider when you are taking dog to the vet. Again, this is not a teaching situation. The dog can be very nervous and the stress level is heightened because the staff have to crowd the dog during treatment. Food or soft voices don't connect with the dogs brain. Trying to force food onto a dog in these situations, just creates more confusion... and again dog can distrust your ability to guide him to a safe conclusion...... "BAD HUMAN".

Behind every Bully is a Coward in disguise.

Both the Bully and the Coward lack confidence. If your dog is barking or growling at 'something'... It is usually because he wants that 'something' to GO AWAY.. If you tell him 'No' but then pat him, again you have sent mixed messages. You can keep talking and patting all you want, but the dog is not paying any attention to you he is focused on the problem in front of him. Mouth is Going and Brain is Not.

HOWEVER ... if the dog does stop for a brief second and realises you are patting him, he can think that you condone this behaviour. So, Dog Barks or Growls... you pat him and use soft calm words ... He is proudly going to continue to Bark and Growl, why not! You seem to like it.... "BAD HUMAN"

Your dog's behaviour is a reflection on you..!! The way you behave will determine how the dog behaves. "Separation Anxiety" more often than not, it is the human who creates this problem.... The human keeps patting the dog and trying to explain they are going and then when they get back they fuss over the dog, always using high pitch worried tones. The dog doesn't understand they are just reacting to humans anxieties... "BAD HUMAN"

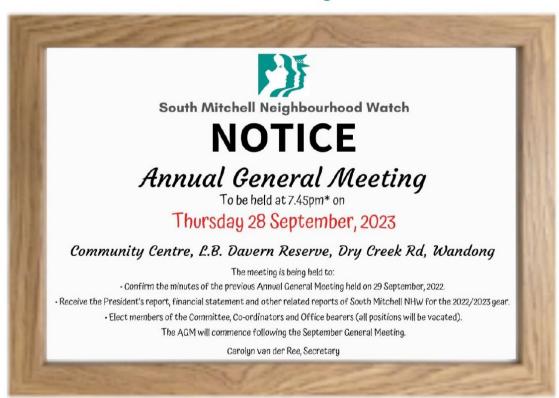

Fibreglass tanks are significantly worse. During a fire, if these explode it is like a car is driven into the side of a structure at about 50 km/hr.

Metal tanks that have a pool liner inside them, or concrete tanks, are the most reliable in a bushfire to hold the water for duration of the fire making it useful for fire fighter defence. Ideally, you will have a gravity feed so you don't have to rely on any means like a pump to give you the pressure for your hose or sprinklers.
