



### WANDONG COMMUNITY **CHRISTMAS CAROLS 2023** DATE AND CHANGE OF VENUE

# GARDEN SCENE WITH GAIL

What a start to Spring, September was so dry that it's a concern and we need to ensure that we water thoroughly to avoid plants drying out, because it will happen all of a sudden. We spot drying leaves but, in many cases, this may be too late for the plant. But whatever, we still can rely on beautiful displays of Jonquils, Freesias and Daffodils and many other bulbs. They seem so hardy and so happy as they put on the loveliest display, and they look fantastic, especially if grown in mass. Daphne has now finished flowering so it's a great time to take cuttings. (I've taken 6 cuttings, and they seem to be doing well). Cut from the plant just above a node and include some older wood on the stem. Make the cut angled and dip it into hormone growth powder, gel or honey and directly into a potting media suitable for cuttings. This media may hold more moisture than a normal potting mix because the cuttings will take time to grow the new white fibrous roots but until then the cuttings need to be kept moist, not wet, to encourage the new roots. You can still take cuttings from Hydrangeas also using the same method, they are such tough plants, and the strike rate is usually 100 %. Roses are leafing nicely so keep the fertiliser up to them for optimum growth and keep an eye out for Aphids. An application of soapy water can deter these pests. After it rains is a good time to apply fertiliser to your lawn and if you have weeds through the grass, 'Weed and Feed' is a great product. If you are transplanting any plants, ensure that you take a generous lot of soil with them and have the hole where they are to go ready. The less time out of the ground and stressing, ensures a better success rate and try to do it in the cool of the day. As our bulbs finish and the green stems begin to die down use a liquid fertiliser that the stems can absorb quickly and take down to the bulb for storage until their next flowering season. Our veggie gardens are looking for new plantings and if you have prepared them already then, you're in front and if you're going with seeds try beetroot, carrot, dwarf beans, climbing beans, peas, lettuce and if you think our frosts have finished pop in tomatoes plants. Corn seems to have a better growth rate if you start with seeds, and it appears you get a taller plant. If you are covering your veggies and/or fruit trees keep in mind that regulations have been introduced stating the hole size in the netting has to be smaller than in previous years. Check it out.



Talking about fruit trees, clear the area at the base of your fruit trees, especially Pear and Cherry trees, to deter the annoying Pear and Cherry slug. These skin-coloured slugs climb up the trunk and feed on the leaves, skeletonising them and thus effecting the ability for the plant to absorb the sun as efficiently. As they mature you can find them easy on the leaves, they are black in colour, but stopping them before they make the journey is preferable. Deciduous plants are looking beautiful, some with blossom, with new leaves pushing through, a real testament to Spring being here. What a beautiful season but keep weeds under control because as the ground dries those pesky weeds are going to be so hard to get out. Now is a good time to prune (on a cooler day) hedging that has finished flowering however, if your hedge is still flowering, prune directly after the flowering finishes and it's amazing to witness how the new growth takes off, if you stand still long enough you may even see it growing!



# Campfire Safety

Don't let your campfire go bush!





### Tips for building a safe campfire:

- Use a built fireplace (where provided) or dig a 30 centimetre deep trench to prevent fire from spreading.
- Create a border around the fire using large dry rocks never use river rocks as they can explode.
- Clear 3 metres of ground surrounding the fire
   remove branches, leaves and twigs and check there are no overhanging branches above the fire.
- Ensure the fire is at least 3 metres away from tents and other camping equipment, especially flammable items such as gas cylinders and fuel.
- Never use flammable liquid or fuel such as petrol or diesel on a fire.
- Always keep a 10 litre bucket of water, and a shovel nearby.

### Things to remember:

- Before lighting always check the weather conditions and fire restrictions in your camping area.
- Do not light or maintain a campfire on hot or dry days if the wind is more than 10 kilometres per hour
- Campfires are **not** allowed on days of Total Fire Ban.
- Never leave your fire unattended, not even for a short time.
- Children and pets should be supervised at all times when near a fire.
- Keep your fire just big enough for cooking and keeping warm, not exceeding one square metre.
- Do not burn dangerous or flammable items, such as aerosol cans as they can explode.
- Check the 'Can I or Can't I' brochure for what you can and can't do during the declared Fire Danger Period and on Total Fire Ban days or visit cfa.vic.gov.au/can

### Putting your campfire out:

- Make sure your fire is completely extinguished using water before leaving.
   Remember, if it's cool to touch, it's safe to leave!
- Do not use soil. Fires can still smoulder under soil and can stay hot for more than eight hours.
   This is a danger to anyone walking in the area once you have gone.

#### You had to be there

Almost every person would have had a response, or heard the remark 'you had to be there". Such was the summary of a recent outing to Melbourne CBD by members of Whittlesea Probus Club.

They travelled to the edge of the Hoddle Grid in early September to visit the Fire Services Museum Victoria and Parliament House.

The coach trip down to Melbourne was uneventful, but it could have been different! Along Hoddle Street we were in the bus lane and travelling at legal speed. Suddenly a motorist making a left turn into a side street propped, due to insufficient room on the line of traffic. The coach drive reacted and did not hit the car!

Past-President and current treasurer Alessandra Testa is becoming quite skilled in organising day trips, and encouraging members to participate. This was to be shown as the day progressed. Some difficulty with the coach driver's instructions and the supply of food at the luncheon venue were addressed by Alessandra and satisfactorily resolved.

Our first excursion was into the fire museum and it was an experience in the history of fire brigades and the manner in which firefighting is conducted. The museum is housed in the original building that dates form 1893 and has National Trust protection.

Our hosts gave a running commentary on the various memorabilia that is on display and a history of fires and fire brigades dating back to the great fire of London in 1066. There are over 10,000 related items contained in the different rooms of the building. These include vintage fire vehicles and appliances, numerous helmets, uniforms, badges and replicas of past personnel.

Unfortunately, it is more a visual and auditory event and writing about it does not give the personnel or the memorabilia justice. [You had to be there!] One thing that is evident today as well as historically is the camaraderie of fire-fighters that has a tendency to involve many generations of families. But it is understandable that groups who have daily risk tend to bond and follow family traditions.

A meal-break had been arranged at a convenient hotel, but some slow service made for an anxious few minutes as our appointment at Parliament House was past-due. It worked to our advantage as our appointment had not been booked correctly. [As an aside one of the members had been taken to our luncheon venue as a young girl on her first date and catered meal.]

So across Spring Street and up the Parliament House steps we went and, after Alessandra sorted things we entered to home of our politicians.

Parliament House is located on Spring Street; the grand colonnaded front dominates the vista up Bourke Street. Construction began in 1855, and the first stage was officially opened the following year, with various sections completed over the following decades; it has never been completed, and the planned dome is one of the most well-known unbuilt features of Melbourne.

Between 1901 and 1927, it served as the meeting place of the Parliament of Australia, during the period when Melbourne was the temporary national capital. The building is listed on the Victorian Heritage Register. Opulence plus is the best description of the internal set up of this seat of power.

Our guide was very skilled and understanding giving us some close personal treatment. We did see something special. A member of staff was explaining to a group of school children how members are elected and the manner in which the Legislative Assembly operates. Again "you had to be there!"


The saying "don't give up your day job" is generally used as sarcastic criticism, but if this lady gave up hers it would be a shame.

### On your toes

At the October meeting of Whittlesea Probus the meaning of a family business was sheeted home when the keynote presenter attended with baby grand-daughter Morgan in tow. [Excuse the pun]

The presentation of the day was organized with the family owned Doreen Towing Service. The owner Caroline Munnery and Towing Operator Brett Dugdale came along to tell us about what is quite a unique organisation. The company is also the RACV roadside assistance contractor and straddles both suburban and rural communities.

The focus of the company is upon breakdown towing, roadside assist to designated areas and agricultural transport, for equipment vehicles up to 5.4 tonnes. This entails providing transport for, but not restricted to, wheeled vehicles for all manner of vehicles and many clients such as automotive workshops and fleet owners.

Cars, floats, tractors, farming implements, caravans, motorbikes, trailers, caravans, shipping containers, light machinery, forklifts, were displayed on a montage of photographs showing the work undertaken.

The pride of the fleet is their flat-bed rotational tray. Most people have seen the run of the mill tilt tray in operation where the tow truck reverses to the front of a disabled vehicle and tilts the tray which becomes a ramp upon which the vehicle is winched. The tray then returns to a flat position and looks just like any other tray truck.

But when Brett arrives at a site to collect a vehicle there may be some issue with the location of the load. Imagine that a vehicle has broken down in a car park and there is insufficient access for the tow truck to back in front.

Doreen Towing has the solution!! The truck stays on the roadway and the tilt-tray is rotated up to ninety degrees and the normal procedures take place. The rotation can be either right of left!

The company also has some uniqueness about it with the RACV contract. If your car is disabled you must call RACV to get assistance. If you only need to tow the vehicle and you are not a RACV member with towing benefits as part of your membership you can call Doreen Towing direct. Should your car be disabled at Doreen and has to be towed that job is allocated by RACV to their suburban contractor. If you are lucky enough to be disabled in Whittlesea and surrounding areas Doreen Towing can do the job.

Given their feeder basin stretches as far as Strath Creek, Flowerdale and Donnybrook and back into congested suburbia the sixty minutes response demanded by RACV can be challenging at times. If the patrol car or tow truck is required at one side of the call out area and it is already attending a call all the

way on the other side it can sometimes be a "near miss".

But towing a vehicle damaged in an accident is a different matter. This may only be done by a licensed tow truck and is controlled by the accident allocation team at VicRoads. Vehicles performing accident towing services must be licensed. These vehicles will be issued with a 'TOW' or 'HTT' number plate. Drivers and passengers (except customers) in tow trucks who attend accident scenes must be accredited.

Brett related some stories from the road of how his job ranges from comforting a

young Mum with kids on board worried about how she will get home to dealing with some arrogant people who make a situation challenging with their behaviour even though they may have caused a crash. It seems that the tow truck operation can be the cause of temporary road closures or delays in moving cars that have broken down or been in accidents.

He reinforced the concern of locals that the district is riddled with potholes and some of their work is coming from disabled motorists who met a pothole to disastrous effect.

Listening to the presentation one can support their web-site statement:

"Doreen Towing prides ourselves on providing stress free, good old fashioned customer service and treat your car/equipment with the highest care and attention. Professional service to both car and client guaranteed".

Photo above displayed showed that they can move anything between an FX Holden and Ferrari. The meeting came to a close with a small token of appreciation presented. It is expected that Morgan will continue the family tradition in a couple of decades hence.





Following a meeting with Mitchell Shire officers, a survey of residents will be conducted to determine the preferred sculpture to replace the rotting wooden sculpture in the Lions Park. We now feel a sculpture depicting Wandong of the past eg timber industry might be most appropriate but residents may have better suggestions.

The ARTC has finally released its preliminary plan for the proposed new bridge. We believe the footpath on the east side of the Broadford Road should be on the west side by going under the bridge. A footpath on the east side would get very little use and requires two pedestrian crossings. We also want guarantees that surfaces used will be graffiti resistant. ARTC still have not provided documentation on how dust, noise, etc will be controlled.

The WHJCG has for many years implored Mitchell Shire to place the drain between the Bushfire Memorial car park and the Epping Kilmore Road underground, remove the bollards and seal the car park to make it the showpiece it should be as a major entrance to Mitchell Shire. The toilets at this location are the most used in Mitchell Shire but the Council chooses to prioritise lesser projects. We are told numbers of requests hold much weight when deciding projects so we ask the WHJ community to get on board and sign our petition or better still lodge a request to Mitchell Shire.

We have asked Mitchell Shire to remove the graffiti on the Council owned pedestrian bridge but this seems to be another time we will have to keep asking or do it ourselves.

Remembrance Day this year is on a Saturday so we expect a larger crowd to attend. The ceremony commences at 10.45am.



The Carer Gateway program has a strong focus on supporting carers to develop skills and knowledge to manage in their day to day caring role.

The Carer Skills courses are a series of free, self-paced learning modules available on the Carer Gateway website <a href="https://skills.carergateway.gov.au/">https://skills.carergateway.gov.au/</a>

There are six skills modules available that provide information, insights and practical tips to help carers develop new understanding and skills important to their caring role. Each module takes approximately 20-40 minutes to complete and you can download your responses to questions in the modules to use as a resource and reminder at a later time.

- Carer Skills 3: Recharge and Reconnect gain a better understanding of the importance of regularly recharging and reconnecting. Learn how to deal with negative feelings such as guilt and create your care team.
- Carer Skills 4: Legal Issues An overview of legal issues including: capacity to make decisions, who can give consent, Power of Attorney, Guardianship, Advance care Directive / Plan
- Carer Skills 5: Social Connections gain a better understanding of the importance of being socially
  connected, build your social connections map, learn how to deal with guilt, fear and anxiety
- Carer Skills 6: Sleep learn more about sleep and its importance to your health and wellbeing, as well as understanding why you don't get enough sleep, what you can do about it and develop strategies to manage your day after poor or no sleep





### Confused about Vaccinations..... ???

Firstly this is not medical advice. I am not a vet, but as a trainer and breeder, I do keep up to date on the subject of vaccinations and this might help you understand how vaccine works.





**Types of Vaccinations -** In Australia there are two main vaccinations we give to dogs, which are referred to as C3 then either C4-C5. (*Note: we do not have Rabies - Dogs who are brought into Australia must have full blood testings for a few months prior to being imported*)

Core Vaccines - Commonly referred to as C3 - This vaccine covers the 3 life threatening viruses,

Canine Distemper Virus, Canine Adenovirus (hepatitis) and Canine Parvovirus (an extreme form of gastro).

Your dog will have a course of 2-3 injections as a puppy and then around 14 month old - after that 3 yearly intervals until your dog reaches 10 years of age. An alternative is to have a blood titre test which will evaluate your dogs immune levels to see if they need to be vaccinated. After 10 years of age your dog is unlikely to need vaccinations. Current science shows that each vaccination has at least a 3-5 year life. In the future we may find that the vaccination may last much longer and the recommendations will eventually filter down thru to the vets.

Non Core Vaccines - If added to C3 is called C4 or C5 injection - Commonly called Kennel Cough or KC.. Parainfluenza virus, Bordetella bronchiseptica, Leptospira interrogans

It is important to note that there are actually about **8 strains of Kennel Cough** but the vaccine only covers two. (Sometimes given as an injection or otherwise as a nasal spray) So even if your dog is vaccinated then it may catch a strain not covered. Current research indicates that the vaccination only has a life of between 6-9 months.

KC Risks - Firstly, it is important to understand that **Non Core virus**' are **not life threatening**. In fact there is usually no treatment needed for the KC virus as it will just run its natural course. However remember that when a dog does have KC they may experience a secondary infection as their immune system may be compromised, this is why IF you take your dog to the vet clinic they may put the dog on antibiotics as a "just in case".

**Symptoms -** When your dog has Kennel Cough he/she may appear perfectly normal but have a definite hacking cough, much like they have something caught in their throat. They may also have a runny nose or reddish eyes (Similar when you have a cold) A cough is often very noticeable if the dog has been running around.

**Treatment of KC** - There is no particular need to take your dog to the vet... much the same as humans having a bad cold virus there is no real need to give antibiotics. Instead the aim is to make the dog comfortable. This means to keep the dog in a warm environment, reduce activity and perhaps provide something to soothe the throat. Remember to avoid your dog having direct contact with other dogs, although it is somewhat random in which dogs are affected. A strong immune system will often mean the dog has reduced likelihood of getting sick.

**Vaccine Regime** - Most vet clinics will offer an annual vaccination... Why...?.. Perhaps this is an easy way for everyone to fall into a routine so they don't forget to keep their dogs vaccinated. However most vaccines don't need annual updates and KC vaccine doesn't cover all the strains. Eventually it would be useful for vet clinics to offer an alternative such as the Titre Test, however they need to make this test cost effective for clients.

Alfoxton Tip: Vaccinations should never be given to your dog if they appear unwell....

### Your Insurance May Not Cover It

If you leave your car unlocked, unattended and with the keys in the ignition in a busy public car park, don't expect an insurer to pay your claim on your car insurance.

So lock your car and close the windows completely when it's unattended, remove the keys from the ignition, accompany anyone who takes your car for a test drive when you're selling it, and avoid

dangerous situations like rising floodwaters.

Property such as phones, tablets, computers, wallets, tools, or personal items that are over the \$500 claim limit can be covered by a general property insurance policy and will need to be claimed for separately.

#### How to prevent motor vehicle break-ins

- Don't leave valuables such as computers, handbags, cash or shopping bags in plain sight within your car;
- If you have a trade or work vehicle, consider installing a lockable tool box to secure your tools and equipment;
- Lock your car and close windows whenever you leave it, even if it's for a minute. This may seem simple but you never know who is watching your movements for a theft opportunity;
- Ensure your vehicle has a working car alarm with a visible blinking red light to deter thieves;
- Park your vehicle in a well-lit area, busy location, near motion-sensor lights, or in a secure garage; and
- Engrave any valuables that you need to keep in your car with a capital 'V' plus your licence number.
