GARDEN SCENE WITH GAIL

Well, Christmas is only a couple of weeks away. Santa is getting ready as are his reindeers, and the elves, putting the finishing touches to everything. Mrs Claus will be cleaning up after another long year and finally getting a chance to perhaps tend her indoor garden? Our gardens will be bursting into the Summer with glorious colours and the weeds will be charging ahead outgrowing everything however, if you can get the weeds under control before the drying conditions take over you will be amply rewarded. How amazing, a weed free garden, is it even possible? As they peep through pull them out, roots and all and if you can do this weekly you may be able to stay on top of it? Follow up with a good layer of mulch and apply around the base of your established trees and plants. This barrier will be so beneficial as the weather warms up to maintain a cool root system, less stress on the plants and a heathier soil. Our fruit trees have flowered and are now producing their little fruit that will quickly become big enough to pick, pears, plums and apples and lots of varieties as well. Jonathon Apples were so popular but now, they appear hard to locate, a small apple, great for lunch boxes. Netting trees is a popular practice but now we need to be very aware that we are using an approved hole size to eliminate trapping smaller birds in the netting. Even though we've had recent rain, it won't take long for the soil to dry so keep in mind as the weather warms up, our plants will experience drier conditions and some plants may have difficulty getting used to variations in weather, (in particular, varieties of natives). As we progress into drier conditions ensure they are watered in a balanced way because extreme variations in moisture availability can greatly affect plants. Deep watering's are preferable to encourage the root system to go deeper into the soil thus, decreasing evaporation of moisture around the surface roots. Natives from Western Australia can find it difficult in our Victorian soils particularly in the areas where the soil is clay based, given that WA is predominantly a sandy soil, ideal for Protea, Waratah, Adenanthos, Leuca-



dendron, Ågonis, Kangaroo Paw and some Grevillea. Of course, these plants grow here however, it is important to prepare your garden to help these plants settle in well by incorporating well-rotted cow manure and Gypsum, good organic additives that assist in grouping the clay into minuscule particles which allows water, air, and nutrients deep down into the soil to assist in keeping the roots healthy. Untreated clay can form a pan surface if you like, that can be impenetrable, and this stops all the goodies from getting to the roots of the plant and don't forget to mulch, this is essential for retaining moisture around the root system. Have a lovely Christmas.

Tips to enjoy a safe summer



If you're heading off for a well-deserved summer break, give yourself some extra peace of mind by being safety and security conscious before you leave and are out on the road.

Summer is almost here, and you're all set for that well-deserved vacation. Whether you're hitting the road in a caravan, jetting off to a beach resort or going camping by the river, it is crucial that you take a few simple precautions to keep yourself and your family safe while you're away. We suggest:

1. Don't tell Facebook what you are doing

It is very easy on community Facebook pages to drop bits of information about where you live – like your nearest cross-road, or your neighbour's name. Wait until you are back to share your holiday snaps and make sure your social media accounts and/or posts are set to private.

2. Secure your caravan

If you're heading off on a caravan adventure, start with the basics. Keep the caravan locked at all times. When parking at the caravan park, reverse it for added security. This makes it harder for any would-be thief to hitch and tow it away. Also, remember to lock your car, especially at beachside locations.

3. Prepare your home

Before you set off, take steps to secure your home. Set timers on lights, making it seem like someone is home even when you're miles away. Ensure all doors, windows and gates are locked tight, providing an extra layer of protection. Don't forget to register your 'Absence from Residence' form with Victoria Police for added patrols past your house.

4. Ask your neighbours to keep watch

Enlist the help of trustworthy neighbours. Ask them to collect your mail, putting out your bins and keep an eye on your property. A little vigilance goes a long way in deterring potential intruders.

5. Use smart technology

Hotlines:

For an extra layer of security, think about installing a video doorbell or a sensor light camera that connects to a mobile app. This way, you can keep an eye on your property remotely, and receive notifications if there's someone at your property. If any suspicious activity is detected, report it promptly to Triple Zero (000).

6. Stay bushfire and flood aware

If you're travelling within Victoria or interstate, stay informed about any fires or other emergencies in or near the area you are visiting. If you're in Victoria, Download the VicEmergency app. If you're travelling to other states, download the corresponding app for that State.



We all know that the festive season can be an incredibly stressful time, however for Australia's 2.7 million unpaid carers, the added pressure of caring for a loved one makes the festive season a little more challenging.

So what can you do to manage your wellbeing during this time?

- 1. Don't be too hard on yourself both you and the person you care for deserve a break. If you are exhausted you will struggle to cope and perhaps have no enjoyment yourself.
- 2. Keep it simple don't set unrealistic expectations and stretch yourself too thin. Routines are good, familiarity is reassuring, and by sticking to regular mealtimes you can reduce some of the pressure.
- **3.** It is OK to change your plans if your instincts tell you that plans are no longer appropriate, then it is ok to change your mind. If you think the person you care for will be unsettled, give yourself permission to cancel or shorten your plans to fit the situation.
- 4. Ask for help we often struggle to ask for help and try to be all things to everybody. Remember that you too are important, so delegate tasks, get some rest and say no to things as appropriate to ease some of the stress.
- 5. Be Positive it's likely that something over the festive season will go wrong. In fact it is almost inevitable. Try not to panic, keep it in perspective, stay positive and try not to let it disrupt your plans.
- 6. Self care find time to do the things you enjoy and that allow you to reset and focus on yourself for a little while. This may be going for a walk, reading or enjoying a bath.
- 7. Eat well It's tough to eat well during the festive season, there are so many things to tempt us away from a healthy diet. Whilst it is ok to enjoy the food and treats on offer, remember to maintain a balanced diet. Eating healthy foods helps to keep you energized, and combined with getting both sleep and rest, can help you cope with the extra stress of the season.
- 8. Plan ahead remember that many shops and services are either closed or have limited hours over the festive season. Make sure you are organized to ensure you have enough medications and other supplies as needed.
- **9.** Enjoy yourself! whilst not everything may go as planned, there will also be times across the festive season that are meaningful and bring you joy. Embrace these as they happen.

A recent newspaper article reported that the average family is now likely to spend \$74,000 over the life of a dog. Enough to buy an Aldi car. This might seem hard to believe until we actually looks at the figures.

The purchase price is the minor cost of owning a dog. But consider the options; Families can be guilted into 'Adopt Don't Shop'- but there are limited pups available in rescue and the outlay is still +\$1,200 as well as passing their scrutiny. A Google Search, finds slick websites from Commercial Breeders selling random pups at \$3,000-\$10,000...

Alternatively, if your heart is set on a Pedigree pup from a Registered Breeder this could cost \$4,000-\$6,000 with likely a 6-9 months wait (But at least these pups have gone thru with required health checks).

Remember, no matter where you source your puppy from - the ongoing costs can often be the same.

Puppy Paraphernalia: So now to a Pet Store to buy the basics. A soft fluffy bed, collar, lead, harness and some toys (because everything looks so cute!) In shock you have just spent +\$300. At home a few weeks later you walk in to what looks like a crime scene with a headless plastic chicken, the bed torn to pieces and stuffing spread around the lounge room. So back to the store to buy a tougher bed, an 'Indestructible' Kong plus a wire crate - that's another +\$300, AND you also now need a new phone charger, a TV remote and new shoes.

Medical: Monthly products such as Flea/Tick/Worm treatments are \$40/month. As a new pet owner you worry about emergencies that could have vet fees of \$2,000 and escalate upwards, so now take Pet Insurance at \$40/ month for basic cover or \$80/month for deluxe and this still doesn't cover everything that can go wrong.

Grooming : If you thought it was expensive going to a hairdresser you are in for a shock. A simple wash & Dry for a small breed can be \$60. Perhaps you thought buying a Non-Shedding breed was a great idea but then find out that every 6 weeks they need to be clipped and manicured which costs upward of \$160 a time.

Feeding : Surely it is just as simple as chuck some kibble in a bowl...NO.. NO.. NO..??? Do you buy the 12 kg of breed specific @ \$160 QR the growing puppy @ \$145. Perhaps your dog has sensitive skin or allergies so he needs a special blend at nearly twice the price of others. With many breeds 12 kg might only last one month.


Training: You attend Puppy Pre-School for \$200, 5 weeks later your clever puppy will SIT, DROP, STAY (for a treat) and you both graduate with a lovely Certificate... But a few months later.... not so cute anymore !! ...Your wondering how to stop the biting, stealing and destroying EVERYTHING! - You hope he will "grow out of it" OR If Dr. Google can't solve your problems, you try the local obedience club, but your dog is very silly or reactive and you can't cope with the class environment. You try private lessons hoping the Professional Dog Trainer can wave their magic wand at \$100-\$200 a session. Perhaps in desperation you send the young offender for a 21 day board and train program, at \$2,500. Seems great but 3 weeks later dog has reverted to old habits.

Day Care and Boarding : If you decide to use a Doggy Day Care to burn up his energy you are up for \$60 a day and of course Boarding or Pet Sitting is still \$40-50 per day. So even just a two weeks holiday is \$600.


It All Adds Up : Consider the first year - if you follow random advice, you could spend \$2,500 on food, \$1,500 on Grooming, \$1,500 on crates, bedding, toys etc, \$500 for vaccinations, \$1,300 parasite treatments and Insurance, \$800 for desexing, \$800 on training, \$600 on Boarding and perhaps \$1,000 on replacing items destroyed like shoes or phone chargers. Your new pup may have cost you over \$10,000 and this doesn't include what you paid for the dog.... Phew!.... aren't you glad you didn't get two puppies....?

Ways To Save : Owning a dog doesn't have to break the bank Instead you need to Budget.

In the first year pups cost more; they may be more likely to have an injury or health problems, so perhaps Insurance works for that first year. If you start training early your pup can have good manners thus avoid many of the pitfalls... Learn how to groom your own dog... Research to find what parasite control you really need...







Look at natural ways to feed the dog instead of using dubious processed food.
